

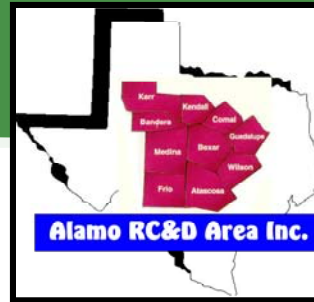
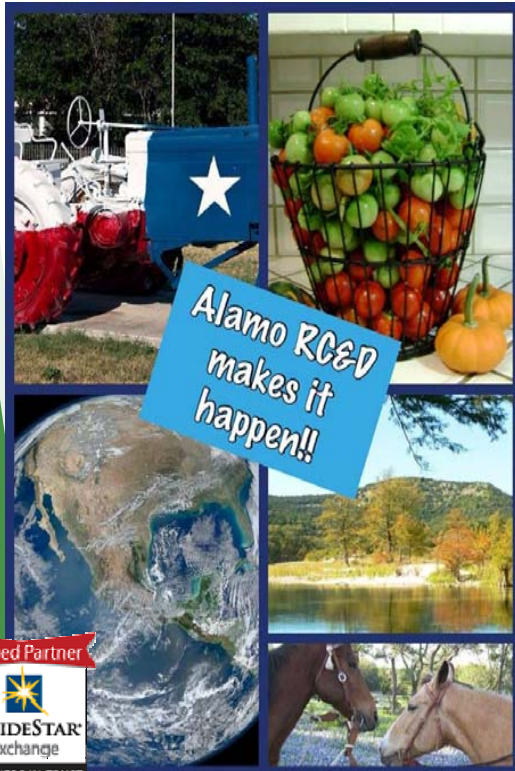

Programs & Activities

The Alamo RCD diversified mission goals are accomplished within the following programs:

- **Environmental Education Program/Watershed Protection/Online Education:** provides educational workshops, online information, seminars and outreach to local citizens on water, rainwater harvesting, riparian systems, natural resource conservation and stewardship and more.
- **Agri-Land Workshops/Online Education:** provides workshops and seminars and online information for those in our agricultural industry and other interested citizens, that promote agricultural sustainability, increase productivity, provide information on land and water management, brush management, wildlife management, and more.
- **Growing Rural Youth Program:** Young people create, fund and implement service learning activities, centered on "gardening with a purpose", that build leadership, provide academic enrichment and life skills, as they also provide the opportunity for youth to give back to their community in need.
- **Senior Assistance Program:** Provides services to rural senior citizens in the areas of improved nutrition, better health and socialization, as we work side by side with rural senior centers and other agencies that assist aging citizens.
- **Community Development Program:** Non-profit workshops, grant training, governance training, fiscal management & fundraising training and direct technical assistance toward improved community services and increased jobs so that our communities thrive. (Fees for service apply)
- **Community Emergency Response Assistance Program:** Assistance toward improved rural fire, emergency and disaster preparedness, disaster medical training and volunteer team readiness for VFDs, EMS and CERT, toward the health and safety of all citizens.
